Thursday, March 25, 2021

The Epsilon Psi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Kristen Davis using the Zoom format with a quorum and the secretary being present. Roll was taken by Carolyn Francis with 17 members in attendance.

Judi Mitchell gave the Chapter Collect, and Ruth Blake led members in the Response.

Old Business:

The February minutes were approved as printed in the March newsletter.

The February financial report prepared by Treasurer Carolyn Francis was printed in the March newsletter and will be filed for audit.

New Business:

President Kristen Davis conducted the business meeting. She acknowledged many are still recovering from the problems caused by the recent difficult freeze. If you are in need of help with freeze related recovery, Kristen has information on how to apply for assistance that Delta Kappa Gamma is offering to members.

Reports of Officers and Standing Committees:

Carolyn Francis announced the form to remit dues is attached to the newsletter. Dues need to be paid before May 31, 2021.

First Vice President Alicia Brooks reported that Ryan Holzapfel will present the April program. Ryan is the Emergency Management Coordinator for Chambers County, and he will present "Preparation Is the Key: Hurricane Preparedness."

Our April meeting will be a Zoom meeting. Kristen will send us an invitation a few days before the meeting.

Reports of Special Committees:

JoAnn Short reported Juanita Hatfield's father passed away. Juanita's mother also passed very recently, so this is a compound grief. We extend our sincere condolences to Juanita and her family.

The Barbers Hill community is experiencing sorrow with the death of Betty Nelson. Betty served BHISD for 35 years, most recently as Transportation Manager.

Julie Kellner's parents are making a big move from their home in Arkansas to Baytown to be closer to Julie and her family. They will be in our thoughts and prayers as we wish them an easy transition.

Program:

Kristen introduced Lori May, Safe Schools Coordinator for Barbers Hill ISD, who presented the program "The Keys to Student Safety." Lori presented different measures that schools are slowly implementing to ensure the safety of our students and staff. Big improvements have been made to school safety in the past few years. TEA has turned over school safety protocols to Texas State School Safety Center and uses them as a clearinghouse for requirements. Safe and Sound Schools is a non-profit organization that provides resources and basic tools for crisis prevention, response, and recovery. The glass in the vestibules is covered with a bullet-proof film. The "Watch Dog" program allows vetted dads to come to the Kindergarten Center through Grade 12 to relate to the kids. Safety Assessment Monitors is a program that enables substitutes to get help. SB11, the Behavioral Threat Management Data Collection Law, requires school employees to collect data concerning threats and assign them to a low, moderate, or high level. A high-level threat requires action. Protocols include removal of lockers, clear backpacks, frequent drills, and police officers accepted as friendly helpers. Other measures are access control, facial recognition that alerts police officers of sexual offenders, anonymous reporting, security camera upgrades that detect vaping devices, emergency management systems and panic buttons. Next year BH is hoping to learn bleeding control measures called "Stop the Bleed." The community and parents accept and appreciate the school district's response to possible threats.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:54 p.m. Ruth Blake led us in the singing of "The Delta Kappa Gamma Song."
