The Epsilon Psi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Kristen Davis using the Zoom format with a quorum established and the secretary being present. Roll was taken by Carolyn Francis with 14 members and a guest being present.

Karen Coffey gave the Chapter Collect, and Joyce Cloudt led members in the Response.

#### **Old Business:**

The March minutes were approved as printed in the April newsletter.

The March financial report prepared by Treasurer Carolyn Francis was printed in the April newsletter and will be filed for audit.

#### **New Business:**

President Kristen Davis conducted the business meeting.

#### Reports of Officers and Standing Committees:

#### Program:

Kristen introduced Ryan Holzaepfel, Emergency Management Coordinator for Chambers County. He presented the program "Preparation Is the Key: Hurricane Preparedness". Ryan reminded us that hurricane season is June 1 through November 30. He began with storm terminology: Watch means conditions are possible; Warning means storm expected so action will be necessary; Tropical Depression means 38 mph wind or less; Tropical Storm means 39 mph wind and better organized. Hurricane category designation begins at 74 mph wind speed for Category 1 and increases with the wind speed all the way up to Category 5. Surge is measured in feet and indicates the level of water the hurricane brings in above the mean tide. You need to evacuate if you are in a surge zone. Run from water. Hide from wind. Be sure to check on friends and family. Leave early if you are in a mobile home, or a low-lying area, or if you need electricity for medical equipment because you may not be able to leave later. Emergency vehicles may be unable to respond. If you leave, turn off the electricity. You can sign up on your county's website if you need help evacuating or have special needs. Disaster supply kits are useful whether you decide to leave or stay. You can purchase one or you can make your own in a waterproof container. Include prescriptions, flashlights, batteries, nonperishable food items, bottled water, and items for pets. Don't wait until the last minute when everyone hurries to the store.

To prepare your home, close and board up windows to protect them from wind driven objects. Lower or remove outside antennas, secure lawn furniture, kids' toys, and garbage cans. Brace the garage door to help stabilize the opening and avoid roof damage above the door. Strap boats down to trailers and tie down. Tie down trampolines and anchor metal buildings. Trim limbs close to the house. Be careful while preparing and be mindful of electrical hazards. After the hurricane, during cleanup, ladders can pose dangers, and falls from roofs increase during this time. Generators can be helpful, but you must keep them 15 to 20 feet away from windows and doors to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning.

Kristen thanked Ryan for sharing his expertise and his time with us and for reminding us we must be prepared for a hurricane that comes our way.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:54 p.m. Joyce Cloudt led us in the singing of "The Delta Kappa Gamma Song".


