Remembering Joy Harrison-Going

Born on November 24, 1933 in Floydada, Texas, Joy A. Going passed away on Monday, December 26, 2016.

As a child and early teen, Joy's father was a migrant farmer, and she and her parents lived on several farms and ranches in the panhandle of Texas.

Joy was an accomplished student growing up, and she graduated valedictorian in high school at age 15. She attended Hardin Simmons University in Abilene where she received her Bachelor of Science degree at the age of 18. She later earned her Administrator's Certificate, Master of Education degree, and a Doctorate in Curriculum and Instruction in the field of education at the University of Houston.

She began her teaching career in Fort Worth, Texas where she taught high school level English and Music. She continued her career as a substitute teacher in Anadarko, Enid, and Norman, Oklahoma. Joy then taught music for two years in grades 1-12 in Spearman, Texas.

Joy began her 34-year career in Baytown education working half-days at Cedar Bayou Junior High and De Zavala Elementary teaching music. Joy then transferred to Harlem Elementary where she helped start the magnet school program, and then three years later, she served as principal for 2 years. Next, Joy moved to Stephen F. Austin Elementary, where she was principal for 14 years. She also served as principal at Pumphrey Elementary for 14 years.

She represented the school district with United Way, was affiliated with the Baytown Crimestoppers Program, where she served as an original board member, served as a Harris County voting precinct judge, and was very involved in church activities.

Joy was a member of the Epsilon Psi Chapter of the Texas State Organization of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, Baytown Education Association, Texas State Teachers Association, National Education Association, Texas Elementary Principals and Supervisors Association, and Texas Association for Improvement of Reading. After Joy's retirement in 2002, she also became involved with the Baytown Area Retired School Employees Association.

Joy was inspired by and felt a calling to work with children after spending time with and looking after her many younger cousins. She continually strived to introduce innovative ideas for teaching and sought to try new methods that would help children learn.

Always a strong proponent of education, Joy requested that in lieu of flowers, donations be made to the educational scholarship fund of her Delta Kappa Gamma chapter which can be sent to: Epsilon Psi, c/o Carolyn Francis, 2104 Buchanan Drive, Baytown, TX 77520.

She was preceded in death by her mother and father John and Winnie Reeves and husband, William Going.

She is survived by her daughters: Jana Ralls Miller and Joni Ralls; granddaughter, Dianna Rothwell Muha and great-granddaughter, Kaylee Ryann Huffman.

Joy's final wishes were to not hold a formal funeral service, but instead requested that her passing be a time of celebration where her friends and family could meet in a time of fellowship and share the bond of life we all share.

Minutes of the Epsilon Psi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International November 17, 2016

Members of the Epsilon Psi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at First Baptist Church on November 17, 2016. The secretary and a quorum being present, President Julie Kellner called the meeting to order at 5:00pm. Judi Mitchell led the chapter collect and response.

President Kellner welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked the hostesses: Richie Butler, chairman, Judy Abshier, Ruth Blake, and Pat Cauley.

Judi Mitchell introduced our guest speaker, Judith Dowling, the founder of the Women's Storybook Project of Texas. Judith gave us information about the WSP. Their mission is to connect incarcerated moms with their children through literature. WSP is active in 9 prisons in Texas at present. The incarcerated moms are required to have 90 days of good behavior to qualify for the program. WSP volunteers go into the prisons with books for ages birth to 12. The moms choose a book for each of their children, record a greeting to their child, and record reading the book to them. These recordings are put on a CD and mailed, along with the book, to the caregiver of the children to give to them. A small group of qualifying inmate moms rotates every 4 months. JoAn Martin, an active WSP volunteer for many years, talked about how to become a volunteer and how rewarding it is.

Reports of Officers and Standing Committees

The October minutes were approved as printed in the November DKG newsletter. The treasurer's report was also in the newsletter and will be filed for audit. President Kellner announced that the Christmas dinner meeting would be on December 8 at 4:30pm at Peter E. Hyland Center. She also reminded the members of Storybook Christmas packing day on December 5, 2016, at Banuelos Elementary. Distribution day for <u>The Gingerbread Bear</u> will be on December 13. Pat Cauley, membership chairman, reminded us of the suggestions to get out and socialize more. She recommended interest groups getting together and passed out an interest form. Chairman Cauley reminded the members that it is acceptable to have spring initiation and encouraged everyone to submit names for membership. Forms can be obtained from and emailed to Pat before the January meeting.
