














Minutes of the Epsilon Psi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International November 16, 2017

The Epsilon Psi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at Rollingbrook Fellowship Church, 505 Rollingbrook, on November 16, 2017. The secretary and a quorum being present, President Julie Kellner called the meeting to order at 5:00 pm.

Laura Kellner led the Collect, and Joyce Cloudt led the Response. President Kellner welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked the hostesses: Michelle Verdun and Shirley Wright.

A beautiful necrology ceremony was conducted in memory of three Epsilon Psi sisters, Joy Going, Gertrude Marsh and Pat Cauley. Dewolyn Hullum introduced guests Ron and Glenna Marsh, Joy Going's granddaughter Diana, and Nancy Cauley. After giving each tribute, a white rose was placed in a vase to symbolize our commitment to remembering them forever. Dewolyn ended the ceremony with the reading of a beautiful poem entitled *She Taught Me* by Elizabeth Watson, a DKG sister. Each of the families represented spoke briefly about what Delta Kappa Gamma meant to their loved one.

Cara Skinner introduced our guest speaker, Barbara Hinojosa. Barbara is from Baytown's Promise Center located on Market Street. She shared with the members some of the things that the Promise Center does. There are currently 24 enrolled in an afterschool study club. They meet twice a week with Promise Center tutors to get help with their homework. Nutrition and hygiene advice and ESL for parents is also offered. The Promise Center keeps up with the kids' progress in school and will talk to teachers to know how to better help the children. Other Promise Center community activities include: health fairs, a coffee bar with internet access, backpack distribution, summer career-oriented camps, workforce solutions for parents, and immigration services to name a few. Paper goods such as paper towels, tissues, and trash bags are always needed. Baytown Promise Center partners with Covestro and Exxon. Barbara says the work is difficult at times but always rewarding. A business meeting followed the program.
