

Minutes of the Epsilon Psi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International November 15, 2018

Members of the Epsilon Psi Chapter of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International met at Rollingbrook Fellowship on November 15, 2018. The secretary and a quorum being present, President JoAnn Short called the meeting to order at 5pm. Laura Kellner led the chapter collect and response.

President Short welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked the hostesses: Judy Abshier, chairman; Ruth Blake, Alicia Brooks, Richie Butler, and Joan Mangum.

Tom Cottar, Public Relations Officer of the American Legion Post 323 and a Vietnam veteran, was introduced as our guest speaker. The program he presented was very informative. The first American Legion caucus was in Paris in March of 1919. Six months later the American Legion was chartered by Congress as a patriotic veterans' organization. It focuses on service to veterans, servicemembers and communities. It has grown into the nation's largest wartime veterans service organization, committed to mentoring youth and sponsorship of wholesome programs in our communities, advocating patriotism and honor, promoting strong national security, and continued devotion to our fellow servicemembers and veterans. Over the years, the Legion has influenced considerable social change in America, won hundreds of benefits for veterans, like the GI Bill, and produced many important programs for children and youth like Boys State. Laura Kellner reminded us that there is a women's American Legion Auxiliary that, among other things, sends a girl to Girls State every year. Shirley Wright participated in Girls State when she was in high school. Mr. Cottar ended his program by reading a beautiful and touching poem called "Just a Common Soldier".

Reports of Officers and Standing Committees:

The October minutes were approved as printed in the November DKG newsletter. The treasurer's report was also in the newsletter and will be filed for audit. The topic is *The Bridge to Literature*, and we are honoring First Lady Barbara Bush by wearing blue and pearls.
- Laura Kellner moved that we approve a \$50 cost to cover the DKG Epsilon Psi part of the DKG Reunion. Seconded and passed.
