
Life itself.



A thank you was given to Judi Mitchell, chairman, and her committee, Amie Briscoe, Diane Keene and Lorena Lankford, for refreshments. Roll was taken by Treasurer Carolyn Francis.

Richie Butler led the Collect, and all members gave the Response.

Old Business:

- The minutes were approved as printed and were in your February newsletter. The treasurer's report was approved and will be filed for audit.
- The Nominations Committee, chaired by Judi Mitchell with members Alicia Brooks and Juanita Hatfield, presented the slate of officers for 2020-2022. - The Founders' Banquet is scheduled for May 7 at Eagle Pointe in Mont Belvieu, but Eagle Point is not available on that date. The motion was made by Carolyn Francis and seconded by Judi Mitchell to keep the meeting place the same but change the date to May 14. Motion passed.
- Alicia Brooks will be in charge of the Epsilon Psi newsletter for the next biennium.
- The Star 3 program will be held in Galveston on March 28. Kathryn Wright will be teaching a photography session.

Program:

Kathryn Wright presented the program, "The Heart of Our Legacy Is the Key to Success". Kathryn has been a member for 47 years. In 1973 her good friend Suzi Powers invited her for coffee, and she was asked to be a member. She was teaching at Robert E. Lee High School, Baytown. Her service to DKG has been on all levels. She made sure we understood the opportunities offered by DKG. Annie Webb Blanton was one of our founders. She was the first woman to be State Superintendent of Education. Mamie Sue Bastian started the Birthday Luncheon. She was instrumental in the Teacher Retirement System. She also started the Classroom Teachers Association. This was responsible for a pay raise. Lalla M. Odom (1917) married, and her contract was changed to substitute teacher. The Austin School Board reversed their decision, and married teachers could receive a "real" contract, not a substitute. If it were not for the dedication and determination of our twelve founders, it would have taken longer to get equal rights for women teachers.

The Project Graduation raffle drawing was held by Debbie Reynolds. Her committee was Judi Craig, Donna Mohlman and Laura Smith. Thanks to all of you.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:25 p.m. with the singing of "The Delta Kappa Gamma Song".
