

Reports of Officers and Standing Committees

- Judi Mitchell also read resignations letters from Meagan Lowery, Paula Jackson and Nova Stippel. The motion was made by Laura Kellner, seconded by Kathryn Wright to accept, with regrets, their resignations.
- Julie Kellner gave information for October's meeting, first there will be an induction of new members and the program will be "Untold Stories".
- Richie Butler, chairman of the Service Project committee, reported the school supplies from the August meeting were distributed to Carver Elementary.

Carolyn Francis, treasurer, announced changes to be made in the 2018-2019 Proposed Budget approved at the August 2018 meeting. Most of the changes were caused by amendments approved at the 2018 International Convention.

Scholarship Fees - Change 40¢ per active/reserve member to 20¢ thus changing the total from \$18.80 to \$9.40

Total State and International Expenses – Change \$3,085.80 to \$3,136.40

Under Local Chapter Expenses

Scholarship Fee - Change 60¢ per active/reserve member to 80¢ thus changing the total from \$28.20 \$37.60

Chapter Scholarship Fund – Change \$471.80 to \$462.40

Total Estimated Expense – Change from \$8,489.80 to \$8,540.40

Estimated Balance - Change \$1,972.68 to \$1,922.08

Motion made by Laura Kellner to approve the adjusted budget, seconded by Shirley Wright. Motion passed.
